PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Beltola College is one of the unique institutions of higher education in Guwahati city established on 18th November 1983, Initially the College was started at Ganesh Mandir Vidyalaya, temporarily as a Night College. But at the initiative of some benevolent persons of greater Beltola area, the college was shifted to Bongaon, Beltola as the Government of Assam has allotted a plot of land (4 Bighas, 2 Kathas) to the college authority. It was established to cater the needs of the students who have a desire to go for higher education of Guwahati City and its periphery in particular and the state as well as the entire NE Region as a whole.

Later on, the generous public encouraged to start the day section in the college. Beltola College is provided a tribal belt certificate by the Govt. of Assam as most of the inhabitants of this locality are tribal population. Moreover, the college has taken a border area certificate as it comes under state government's jurisdiction.

The college is situated about 6 K.M. away from Dispur, 16 K.M. away from Guwahati university and 5 K.M. away from Khanapara and is easily approachable from all side. The College is permanently affiliated to the Gauhati University. The college offers B.A. Degree under G.U. The untiring and dedicated efforts of public, well wishers, principal, teaching and non-teaching staffs have greatly contributed to its all round success in becoming one of the great higher educational institutions under Gauhati University.

A BRIEF INTRODUCTION

The guardians, parents and students are asked to go through the prospectus carefully before filling up and signing the admission forms. After the form is signed, the total responsibility of having read the rules and regulation shall be with the guardians, the parents and the students and they will be bound by the same. Prospectus and forms may be collected from the college office on payment of Rs. 150/ Only.

Seats are also reserved for students belonging to SC/ST(P)/ST(H)/. MOBC/OBC as per Govt. rules. Few seats are also reserved for physically handicapped students and students having proficiency in sports, cultural and N.C.C.

THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS SHOULD BE PRODUCED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

- A) Original Mark-Sheet, Admit Card, Certificate of the last qualifying examination, H.S registration certificate and pass certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
- B) Gap certificate whenever necessary will have to be produced. It has to be issued by a Gazetted Officer/Head of the institution. (Govt. Recognized Institute) last attended. Gap exceeding two years will not be accepted.
- C) Three copies of recent passport size photographs.
- D) Original Caste certificate (certificate by District Asministrative Authority viz. D C/ SDC) will have to be produced for admission against caste quota. Provisional certificates will not be considered.

ADMISSION

The academic session commences from June. Admission to the B.A Semester Course is held after the announcement of H.S. Examination Result. Application should be made in the prescribed form available with the College Prospectus (on payment of Rs. 150/-) Forms may be obtained from the college officer).

The dates of admission to the various classes are notified in the local press after declaration of the H.S. Results. Admission to the College is strictly on merit basis. There is also provision of admission for outstanding sportsmen and artists. All admission made to the college are provisional and subject to the final approval of the University. The college is not responsible for such the migration certificate, eligibility certificate or admission where are found to be false statements.

Again, the students have to produce original Marks-sheets, Certificates etc. at the time of admission. Attested copies of the same are to be enclosed with the application forms.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. **Class attendance** : The student must attend 75% of the total classes, otherwise they will be treated as dis-collegiate and will not be able to appear in the final examination of the university.
After joining the college, each student is placed under the personal supervisor and guidance of Head of the Department for each subject who maintains a detailed record of the students progress in studies and also keep an eye on their general conduct inside the class room.
2. **College Examination and Project Works:**
 - a) Sessional Examinational in every Semester
 - b) Class test every month
 - c) Seminar, Assignment, Library works, project etc.
3. **Identity Card** : An Identity Card issued to every student which is to be kept by him/ her during college hours. Any loss or damage of the Identity Card must be immediately reported to the college authority.
4. **Meditation Programme** : The meditation programme are conducted by pioneer Human Development Organization and Swami Vivekananda Kendra, Kanyakumari, Guwahati Branch for the welfare of the students.
5. **College Uniform** : **Boys** - Black formal Pant & Sky Blue Shirt with Stripes.
Girls - White Salwar & Kamiz Sky Blue with Stripes along with White Dupatta
6. **Motivation Programme** : The motivational Programmes are conducted for the students of Beltola College by Various institutes.
7. **Games and sports, literary & cultural activities** : competitions and debates are organized from time to time for the benefit of the students of the college. These are organized by Beltola College Student Union with guidance of teaching staffs. Competitions to various extra-curricular streams are held during the annual college week festival. Good performers can represent the college in the GU youth festival and other inter college Programmes.
8. **Ragging** : Ragging is strictly prohibited. Any one found indulging in any act of ragging will be dealt as per rule. The Honourable Supreme Court has directed that ragging be banned from all educational institutions. Ragging has been made cognizable offence and it attracts a punishment of rigorous imprisonment of 3 years jail or a fine of Rs. 2500/-.
9. **Library** : The college Library has nearly 6000 books on different subjects. The textbook section contains copies of various textbooks for the benefit of the students. There is a sizeable number of reference books, news papers and important journals and magazines. It is compulsory for students to issue library card and they can borrow one book against it. There is a separate sitting arrangements for boys and girls in the reading room of the library. Besides the library has also internet facilities.

10. **Use of Mobile Phones:** Use of mobile phones by students inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.
11. **Canteen :** The collage has a canteen of its own where can have good and hygenic foods.
12. **General Rules for maintaining discipline:**
 - a) The students are expected to show proper respect to their teachers, be polite with one another and show courtesy to the employees of the college.
 - b) In order to maintain academic atmosphere in the college, students should not make noise while moving in the campus, sitting in the library and the common rooms. Movement from one class to another should be orderly. In off periods students may go to the library or common rooms.
 - c) Pasting and circulating of undesirable notice and pamlets by the students anywhere in college premises shall require the approval of the Principal.
 - d) Unauthorized persons are not allowed to move inside the college campus.
 - e) The students are expected to maintain cleanliness inside the college campus.

7. Environmental Studies Cell : The Students are compelled to participate in the survey which is related to Environmental Studies and it is conducted by the Environmental Studies Cell in

various parts of Assam every year.

AISHE CELL : Following the instructions of Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and DHE of the Government, Beltola College founded All India Survey of Higher Education Cell in 2011, under the supervision of Dr. Deepali Ojah(Principal), Asstt. Professor Kamaruj Jaman (Dept. of Eng.) was appointed as Nodal Officer, AISHE, Beltola College.
- 9. Campus interview through placement cell : The Beltola College had started placement interviews from 2013. The campus interviews for 2014 were held in the college premises by various consultancy groups.
- 10. Beltola College Students’ Union : There is a student union of Beltola College viz. Beltola College Student Union (BCSU). The members of the union are elected through the election.
- 11. The College Magazine “Garima”: The College Magazine ‘Garima’ is published annually. It gives an opportunity to the students for self expression in different fields. Garima is run by an editorial board consisting of members of the teaching staffs and the students.
- 12. Student Aid Fund : On application to the Principal of the College, an amount not exceeding the annual tuition fees is granted to the needy and meritorious students whose father’s / guardian’s annual income does not exceed Rs. 3600 to enable them to pay tuition fees etc.
- 13. Departmental Seminar cum project: The various departments of the college held seminar, lecture. Project, field work according to the programme fixed by the concerns.
- 14. Career Guidance and Counselling : There is a career guidance and counselling cell in the college. The faculty-in-charge of the cell arranges for talks with career counselling experts so that the students can benefit from such interactions. Through such counselling the students get relevant and necessary information about career prospectus.

Moreover, the college authority has also introduced the Krishna Kanta Handiqui’s Open University courses like - B.P.P. and Degree as well the Degree course from I.D.O.L. under Gauhati University.

The above mentioned courses are introduced by the authority of the college, keeping in view of the working people.
